## Sports Gambling: Risks and Rewards

January 31, 2019

On January 31, O'Melveny and EY Forensics hosted an in-depth discussion regarding the impact of *Murphy v. National Collegiate Athletic Association*, the Supreme Court's May 2018 decision that opened the door to states legalizing sports gambling.

Panelists representing diverse areas of expertise provided insight into the ramifications of *Murphy*, including business and legal perspectives from professional sports leagues, mobile betting operators, casinos, and media industry insiders. The panel discussion generated a dynamic exchange focused on the burgeoning opportunities for revenue generation associated with legalized sports gambling, as well as an analysis of the associated compliance risks of entering into the sports gambling marketplace.
